

A Bibliography of Illinois Civil War Regimental Sources in the Collections of the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library

Part 1, Published and Printed Sources

Some fourteen years ago an Illinois State Historical Library (ISHL) patron asked this onetime reference department employee about the availability of sources relating to a single Civil War regiment. In response to that inquiry, a bibliography was compiled for that regiment. With the increased interest in the Civil War, in part due to the success of Ken Burns's *The Civil War*, similar requests were received on a semiregular basis. The end result, which was first published in 1994, was a bibliography of ISHL sources for all of the Illinois Civil War regiments. With the collections of the ISHL now housed at the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library (ALPL), it becomes important again to make researchers aware of the immense diversity of the collections within the new library building.

Part 2 of this bibliography, which covers the collections of the Manuscript Department of the ALPL, will appear in a future issue of the *Journal of Illinois History*.
