1. WHAT IS PsycINFO (WebLUIIS version)?

PsycINFO on WebLUIIS covers worldwide literature of Psychology, Psychiatry, Mental Health and related subjects. It contains citations and abstracts to journal articles (1887 to date), dissertations, technical reports, books, and book chapters (1987 to date). WebLUIIS searching interface is used to search PsycINFO here.

There are several vendors who have bought the PsycINFO tapes from the American Psychological Association, and offer it either as an online system (Ovid, DIALOG, SilverPlatter) or as a CD-ROM database or over the Internet (WebSPIRS, WebLUIIS). The content is the same in all versions, however, the searching methods are different.

Coverage includes both human and animal aspects in these fields: animal psychology; applied psychology; communication and language; cultural influences and social issues; developmental psychology; education; neurology and physiology; perception and motor performance; personality; physical and psychological disorders; psychometrics and statistics; treatment and prevention; personnel and professional issues.

3. BASIC SEARCH STRATEGY:

1. Pick a search topic: for example, **Coping with arthritis in adults**
2. Divide topic into concepts:
3. Find words (**keywords**) or subject headings (**MeSH**) to represent these concepts.
4. Combine concepts with AND or OR.


SAMPLE SEARCH STRATEGY WORKSHEET

Write each concept on the top line. Then list synonyms or related terms separated by ORs. **These are the keywords for your topic.**



4. COMBINING CONCEPTS with AND or OR:




coping behavior *OR* emotional state

Searching for records containing *either* term (OR) will retrieve more records.



rheumatoid arthritis *AND* adult

Searching for records containing *both* terms (AND) will retrieve fewer records.



#3 NOT #4

Eliminating terms in one set from a previous set (NOT) will retrieve fewer records.

Truncation:

- The symbol ? serves as a substitute for zero or more characters.
For example: **risk?** retrieves **risk, risks, risk-taking**

SEARCHING in PsycINFO (WEBLUIS) Database

Most databases in WebLUIS offer 3 search options: BASIC, ADVANCED, and COMMAND searches.

Menu Bar:



History: See the searches you have entered in any database during the current WebLUIS session.

Change Databases: returns to the WebLUIS main page for more choices without clearing your search history.

Restart: returns to the WebLUIS main page, clearing your search history.

5. BASIC SEARCH:

When you select PsycINFO database, the *Basic* search screen appears. Use it to search for a known item by author or title or for a simple subject or keyword search. Click to highlight your choice in the **Select a Search Type** box. Then type your **search term(s)** in the box on the right and click on **Submit Search**.

6. ADVANCED SEARCH:

To enter a more complex search, choose *Advanced* search mode from the toolbar, at the top or bottom of the screen. The Advanced Search Screen contains an extended search form, which enables you to enter search terms in various field groupings.

Click on the pull-down boxes labeled **Search in:** to display the list of search types, and highlight the field you want to search. Then type your **search term(s)** in the box on the right. You may combine search terms by selecting AND, OR, NOT between the term boxes.

This form also allows you to further limit your search by document type, classification code, subject population group, subject age group, form/content type, date, etc. By clicking on the downward arrow at each box to select from the list of options. Click [**Submit Search**] to perform the search.

7. LIMIT BY CLASSIFICATION CODE:

The PsycINFO Content Classification Code System is a collection of broad categories and subcategories reflecting content areas in the covered literature. The broad categories are as follow:

Searching the codes is a convenient way to limit an existing subject search to a particular focus, such as treatments, without typing in many different keywords that could describe the topic; to browse recent studies in a broad subject area; and to reduce irrelevant retrieval.

For example if you are interested in personnel selection in the military, you don't have to list terms separately for personnel in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, National Guards, etc. Instead, use the code for "Military Psychology" in the classification code system field to search for different types of military professions. Type **38?** to retrieve the main category and all the subcategories.

Note: Avoid searching main category ending in 00, e.g., searching 3800, retrieves very general

documents and will not include subcategories such as Army, Navy, etc. Do not search two class codes ANDed together; most records are classified only under one category (occasionally under two).

5. Use WebLUI Basic search → Select **Journal/magazine Title** → Type "*Journal of Adolescent Health*" → Click on Submit →Journal title List appears →Click on the **URL link** appears under the journal title → List of available volumes appears →Click on the volume and issue you need →Find the right title or pages →Click on **Journal format- PDF**.

9. HOW TO BROWSE A JOURNAL AND GET A FULL-TEXT ARTICLE ONLINE?

In the Basic search mode select Journal Title and type **journal of clinical psychology** in the search box. WebLUIIS displays a guide screen as illustrated below:

10. VIEWING RESULTS:

The search results are automatically displayed in a list of ~25 short records. Each record contains the information of article title, journal title, year of publication, volume and issue numbers, page numbers and followed by first author's name. Note the marking check box on the left of each record.

MARKING RECORDS:

- You can Mark and Print/Email up to 99 Records at a time.
- To mark a record, click on the mark box at the upper left corner of each record.
- To unmark a citation, click on the box again. The check mark will be removed.
- To print the marked records click on [**Print Marked**] and a dialog box appears as below:

To print or download the records you have marked, please select a record format. You can then use your browser's "Print" or "Save as" functions to send the formatted records to a connected printer or to a floppy disk.

Some WebLUIIS databases including PsycINFO are accessible using the bibliographic management programs Endnote, Reference Manager, and ProCite. In order to use these programs with PsycINFO (WebLUIIS), you must configure your bibliographic management program to point to the Florida Center for Library Automation (FCLA) Z39.50 server.
